



THE CATHOLIC'S ATTEMPT TO CHANGE GOD'S LAW

I
Thou shalt have no other gods before me.

II
Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth: Thou shalt not bow down thyself to them, nor serve them: for I the LORD thy GOD am a jealous GOD, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate me; And showing mercy unto thousands of them that love me, and keep my commandments.

Six days shalt thou labor, and do all thy work: But the seventh day [Saturday] is the sabbath of the LORD thy GOD: in it thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that is within thy gates: For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day [Saturday]: wherefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day, and hallowed it.

V
Honor thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the LORD thy GOD giveth thee.

VI
Thou shalt not kill.

VII
Thou shalt not commit adultery.

VIII
Thou shalt not steal.

IX
Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor.

X
Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's house, thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's wife, nor his manservant nor his maidservant, nor his ox, nor his ass, nor anything that is thy neighbor's.

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

As Abbreviated in Vernacular Roman Catholic Catechisms*

*"He shall think himself able to change times and laws."
Daniel 7:25, Douay Version.

I
I am the Lord thy God. Thou shalt not have strange gods before Me.

II
Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain.

III
Remember thou keep holy the Sabbath day.

IV
Honor thy father and thy mother.

V
Thou shalt not kill.

VI
Thou shalt not commit adultery.

VII
Thou shalt not steal.

VIII
Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor.

IX
Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's wife.

X
Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's goods.

* Such as Keenan's and Geiermann's in English. The two vernacular catechisms here quoted and many more like them, bear the imprimatur of bishops of the Church and are used for teaching the laity.

Read carefully the differences between the two Ten Commandments. The first is the law as it was written by God and given to the world; the second is the law as changed by the Roman Catholic Church. You can see that the second commandment that forbids idol making and worship has been completely removed in the Catholic version of the law, and to make up for the shortfall they have taken the tenth clause in the law of God and have split it into two separate laws thus making back ten clauses. Also, you would observe that the fourth clause in God's law is now the third clause in the Catholic version, and it is so ambiguously worded so that are would not know which day is the Sabbath of YHWH. This was done by the Church in order to hide the fact

that it is the seventh day (known today as Saturday) and not Sunday, the first day of the week, that ought to be kept as the Sabbath day as imperatively required by God to all men. But then the Roman Catholic Church is bold and defiant enough before God to declare that they have changed God's Law. God said "The works of his hands are verity and judgement; all his commandments are sure. They stand fast for ever and ever ..." Ps 111:7,8. "Think not that I am come to destroy, the law or the prophet: I am not to destroy, but to fulfill. For verily I say unto you, Till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law till all be fulfilled."
